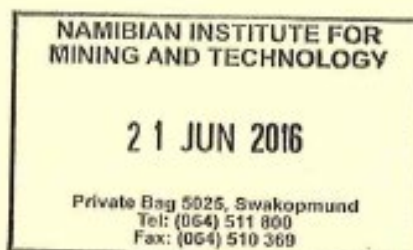

Dear Rössing team,

Congratulations on your issue of momentos for Rössing over the years.

I was sent them by Bill Birch this week. Bill, you may not know, was the first Security Manager at Rössing - appointed in, probably, 1978 by myself, who was then General Manager of Rössing, from 1977 to 1986.

I was appointed by the then Chairman of Rössing, the late Ronald Walker of RTZ, London, to develop a non racial mine in Namibia - to be a credit to Nambia and RTZ.

This at the time when Rössing was in South West Africa, administered by South Africa in a racially legislated country. A hard task indeed - especially as the mine then was running at a huge financial loss, its employee severance rate was in the high 80 percentile, and was run by the

Craig Gibson, who was hugely influential in developing the Rössing 'ethos'.

I have already written for my own interest and posterity the story of Rössing; how I closed what was then to be an underground operation, discharged the majority of its managers and sought out and appointed a new team of managers who took the mine from a struggling hulk in the desert to a very successful non racial company.

My managers: Mike Bates, who I brought from British Steel; George Deysel - Engineering; Wotan Swiegers - Medical and Environmental; Sean James - Mining; Brian Burgess - Personnel; George Macras - Administration.

Together we rebuilt the mine from a very difficult position, designing and creating Arandis, employing our first Namibian (Maria Dax) to overview the transition, the Swakopmund Cottage Hospital, the Arandis High School,

winning the NOSCAR safety awards to the extent that we were recognised as the premium industry in Southern

Africa and excluded from future competitions in order to motivate other companies!

We developed communication systems, employee award systems, built the Rössing Country Club for employees

and their wives, built two churches, developed a formal works committee system where all workers could have a say and voted for their representatives, sent countless Namibians to universities overseas, encouraged and demanded non-racial sport. I could go on . . .

So congratulations to all at Rössing on your 40 years of history. This year in September I hope to visit Swakopmund with my wife and would like to visit the mine again!

I am, of course, now retired and live in Western Australia
